is central in order to strengthen their sexual and reproductive rights at the time of an abortion. Contraceptive counselling aims to support women's reproductive control and prevent unintended pregnancies, but it is unclear how to provide contraceptive counselling and how to organise services at the time of an abortion in order to achieve this aim. The aim was to study women's choices and use of contraceptive methods post-abortion. This research also aimed to describe contraceptive counselling in the context of an abortion from women's and health professionals' perspectives. Initial studies informed subsequent improvement efforts also evaluated in the thesis regarding contraceptive counselling and services at the time of an abortion. Design and methods: The studies in this thesis involved quantitative studies i and iv and qualitative studies ii-iv. Methods performed at six departments in southeast Sweden. Study i had a quantitative and longitudinal design. The medical records of 987 women were reviewed regarding women's choice of contraceptive method at the time of an abortion and the odds of repeat abortion within three to four years. Studies ii and iii were qualitative interview studies in which 13 women (study ii) and 21 healthcare professionals (study iii) described their experiences of contraceptive counselling at the time of an abortion. Interviews were analysed using interpretive phenomenology (study ii) and conventional content analysis (study iii). Study iv was a case study regarding a qualitative improvement collaborative quality improvement collaborative (qic) designed to improve contraceptive counselling and services. Three multi-professional teams involved in abortion care participated in the qic and two women provided user experience input. Both qualitative and quantitative data were collected and analysed. Results: The findings in the thesis are organised into three themes. i) Women and healthcare professionals described contraceptive counselling at the time of an abortion as an often complex meeting. There was scepticism towards contraceptive methods and limited receptivity to information among women. Respectful counselling facilitated women's choice of contraceptive method, even if they were sceptical. ii) The situation was emotionally charged. ii) Women's choices need for guidance and access to a range of contraceptive methods was described in the second theme. Choice of oral contraception dominated overall. 25% of the women experienced repeat abortion during follow-up. Women who chose long-acting reversible contraception (LARC) experienced fewer repeat abortions compared to women who chose oral contraception (OC). Both women and healthcare professionals reported barriers in access to LARC post-abortion. iii) In a quality improvement collaborative qic, two volunteering women provided user experience input. Healthcare professionals participating in this qic reported strengthened skills in counselling and enhanced ability to evaluate their performance. Despite the team's prediction that they would reach the qic goal that 50% of women would start LARC within 30 days post-abortion, a majority of the women in qic units chose LARC. None of the teams managed to reach the goal, primarily due to insufficient capacity for timely initiation of LARC. Conclusion: The findings suggest that women need respectful counselling and guidance at the time of an abortion. Access to a range of contraceptive methods, particularly LARC, is important to prevent repeat abortions. There is room for further improvement in offering coordinated and timely access for women who choose LARC and to evaluate counselling in the present settings. How does a pro-choice doctor who once performed abortions for Planned Parenthood wind up on the opposite side of this embattled issue? the author tells her emotional story you will come away with a new understanding of the complexity of life the risks of abortion the power of prayer and the greatness of god's forgiveness which is big enough to cover the pain of all affected by this controversial procedure unexpected choice is told from the perspective of a doctor who actually performed abortions through planned parenthood the book chronicles her journey from being a pro-choice physician to someone speaking on behalf of the pro-life movement irvin m cushing mph it is both remarkable and at the same time a sign of this era of rapid change that refer back to the infancy of a field which has existed for barely more than a decade you now reads of the maturing of the family planning and abortion fields both of which were incorporated into our society and integrated into our health care system within the past years indeed in the very year that this book is being prepared we note the tenth anniversary of several significant events of 1970 1 the enactment of title x of the public health service establishing a federal program in family planning 2 the first issuance by a major health-related organization the apha of a policy statement advocating repeal of all abortion laws 3 the enactment by new york state of an abortion law whose only restriction was that it be performed by a licensed physician and the subsequent action the first by any local health department new york city to assure both its implementation and its quality they were eventful days these three events seemed to presage a then unprecedented acceptance of fertility regulation as a right and as a needed service this thought provoking book sets forth ethical arguments for a woman's right to choose drawing on the traditions of sociology psychology thinking and moral philosophy it maintains that there is a strong moral case for recognizing autonomy in personal decision making about reproductive intentions more than this it argues that to prevent a woman from making her own choice to continue or end her pregnancy would undermine the essence of her humanity the author a provider of abortion services in tennessee asserts that true respect for human life and true regard for individual conscience demand that we respect a woman's right to decide and that support for a woman's right to a term abortion has moral foundations and ethical integrity this fresh perspective on abortion will interest both pro and anti-choice individuals and organizations along with academics in the fields of gender studies philosophy ethics and religion based on extensive original field research the provocative collection presents case studies from thailand cambodia burma vietnam bangladesh indonesia and india it includes an insight into the conditions and hard choices faced by women and the circumstances surrounding unplanned pregnancies where do you turn when you are wrestling with a painful decision you turn to your spouse trusted friends and relatives to professionals to religious advisers but sometimes you want accurate information and suggestions all in one place in a form you can use on your own the decision to have an abortion is not an easy one and it is not the right decision for every pregnant woman even in difficult circumstances every situation is different women considering an abortion range in age from nine to fifty five years they are rich and poor married and unmarried white black brown yellow and red members of every religious group and ethnic origin heterosexual and homosexual some have no one to talk to and others have too many people talking to them some are in danger from physical sexual and emotional abuse and the facts and feelings is for women who are considering whether to have an abortion work

This is an innovative and challenging collection that will be of key interest for scholars studying reproductive rights and reproductive justice, as well as women and gender studies. Representing Abortion is organized to structure upper-level undergraduate and graduate courses on reproductive rights and reproductive justice in an accessible and engaging way. Nearly half of all pregnancies among U.S. women are unintended, and four in ten of these are terminated by abortion. The writings in this anthology have been selected to introduce the reader to the broadest possible spectrum of viewpoints on the abortion debate. A question and response format prompts readers to examine complex issues from multiple angles. Students are encouraged to see the validity of divergent opinions so they may understand the debate inclusively. Fact boxes are included to summarize important information for researchers. Sets out guidelines that can help reduce the high levels of maternal morbidity and mortality associated with abortion, whether spontaneous or induced. Recommendations and advice are backed by extensive practical experience and rooted in the principle that emergency care for the complications of abortion should be available 24 hours a day in every health care system. In view of the need to prevent life-threatening complications, the book also establishes standards of safe abortion practice for use in those countries where abortion is permitted by law. Prevention of abortion through education and family planning is likewise discussed. Addressed to health managers, administrators, and care providers, the book follows a step-by-step approach to the provision of emergency and preventive care. The first three chapters describe the magnitude of mortality and morbidity caused by unsafe abortion, define the essential components of abortion care at each level in the health system, and describe the ways in which legal and societal factors affect abortion behaviour and care. Against this background, the remaining eleven chapters provide technical and managerial guidelines for each component of service at each level of the health system needed to ensure that all women have access to care 24 hours a day. A chapter on planning is followed by three chapters outlining the clinical elements of emergency abortion care. Of particular value is a chapter on patient information and counselling, which emphasizes the importance of providing information in a supportive manner. Other chapters offer detailed guidance on the facilities, equipment, and drugs needed for abortion care, on the training and supervision of staff, and on ways to overcome several obstacles that make it difficult for women in remote, rural, and

and set free receiving a restored and renewed heart this study is perfect for the person who wants no one else to know as well as a small group setting it may be used in a women's study and pregnancy center it offers healing techniques for counselors or a group of friends who share the same desire for healing undoubtedly with one in three women having had an abortion in their past this workbook will surely appeal to many especially those fearful of someone finding out their secret i invite you to walk this healing journey together one at a time argues strongly for the need for abortion law reform right across the country the tragedies of the past and the tragedy of the present can never occur again never again the main aim of this practical handbook is to strengthen counselling and communication skills of skilled attendants such as nurses and other health providers helping them to effectively discuss with women families and communities the key issues surrounding pregnancy childbirth postpartum postnatal and post-abortion care counselling for maternal and newborn health care is divided into three main sections part 1 is an introduction which describes the aims objectives and the general layout of the handbook part 2 describes the counselling process and outlines the six key steps to effective counselling it explores the counselling context and factors that influence this context including the socio-economic gender and cultural environment a series of guiding principles is introduced and specific counselling skills are outlined part 3 focuses on different maternal and newborn health topics including general care in the home during pregnancy birth and emergency planning danger signs in pregnancy post-abortion care support during labor postnatal care of the mother and newborn family planning counselling breastfeeding women with HIV/AIDS death and bereavement women's violence linking with the community each session contains specific aims and objectives outlining the skills that will be developed and corresponding learning outcomes practical activities have been designed to encourage reflection provoke discussions build skills and ensure the local relevance of information there is a review at the end of each session to ensure the students have understood the key points before they progress to subsequent sessions

published in 1986 *Abortion and the Private Practice of Medicine* was the first book to address abortion from the perspective of physicians in private practice Jonathan B. Imber spent several years observing and interviewing all twenty-six of the obstetrician-gynecologists in a city that did not have an abortion clinic the decision as to whether when and how to perform abortions was therefore essentially up to the individual doctor Imber begins the volume with a historical survey of medical views on abortion and the medical profession's response to the legalization of abortion in the United States quoting extensively from his interviews he identifies various characteristics of doctors that may affect their professional opinion on abortion including age gender religious background and length of residence in the community the nature of their training and prior experience and the setting of the practice whether group or solo Imber found that the physicians' reasons for agreeing or refusing to perform abortions revealed considerable differences of opinion about how they construe their responsibilities Imber shows that many of the physicians he interviewed were deeply ambivalent about abortion approving in general of a woman's right to an abortion but not wishing to perform it themselves he argues that until abortion loses its status as a morally and politically controversial matter it will remain the doctor's dilemma a new introduction and epilogue
